Message from the Board

The December and March meetings were held as scheduled. The planned Lake Maintenance Activities such as Curly Leaf Spraying and Weed Harvesting were discussed and these activities will continue as in past years based on the Lake Survey, Weed Growth and Permit Approvals.

A lake survey was completed in Mid-April 2023 for Curly Leaf Pondweed and a small amount was detected. The DNR recommended to skip treatment. Spraying for Eurasian Milfoil was completed based on lake survey conducted last fall. Cason & Associates, LLC performed the treatment on May 4, 2023 and the DNR was with them monitoring the process. The proposed herbicide was Aquathol K[®] (endothall). There are no restrictions on fish consumption or swimming associated with this herbicide. Warning signs were posted at the time of treatment.

Currently Weed Harvesting is not scheduled to be done unless weed conditions warrant it and DNR permitting is approved. We did no weed harvesting in 2022 due to the improved weed control achievement.

Q: What about the high lake levels that continue?

A: The McGinnis Lake level is controlled by the dam which is owned and maintained by Adams County. The County is continuing to monitor the level to make sure we don't experience the excessive water levels as happened late last summer into the fall season. Last fall the dam intake was partially blocked and a diver came out and dislodged what appeared a clump of shoreline from somewhere on the lake. Once the obstruction was removed the lake level returned to normal. The levels are the highest I have seen in the 50 years as a lake resident and will take a period of time to settle back to a more constant level as we once enjoyed. Of course this is based on Mother Nature providing a more even flow of precipitation. Adams County Land & Water is also in the process of reconnecting the electronic monitoring system that once monitored the level and provided feedback on the water level. A firm date has yet been provided to us but will continue to stay in contact with them to completion of the full time connection.

Q: Have You Seen The Sign? Friends of McGinnis Lake adopt-a-highway!!!

The adopt-a-highway program is the official coordination system for the generous volunteer efforts to remove trash, recyclables and litter from Wisconsin's roadsides. Adopt-A-Highway helps reduce litter along Wisconsin's highways, builds statewide support for the anti-litter and highway beautification programs. It educates the public about properly disposing of litter, enhances the environment and allows for more beauty along Wisconsin's roadsides. Friends of McGinnis Lake adopted a 1.7 mile stretch of Cty Hwy G, from Brooks to Ember Ave. Who are the friends of McGinnis Lake? Everyone can be a friend of McGinnis Lake. Q: What can I do to help the McGinnis Lake District?

A: We are currently looking for volunteers to help the District doing water quality surveys. These surveys don't require a lot of time but need to be completed to insure the lake quality is the best it can be. The surveys begin in the spring and take less than an hour of your time throughout the summer at your convenience. Training is available and all the necessary items to complete the tests are supplied. Please contact Ken Roberts (608-617-6723) regarding helping us with this activity.

Q: What if I want to make changes to my shoreline or cut down trees?

A: Any actions within the lake buffer zone and outside for tree cutting requires Adams County Zoning and Planning Approval similar to a building permit application. Failing to do that may result in fines in accordance with county laws. Please contact the Adams County Zoning and Planning for permit information.

Q: Burning Permits!!! Everyone should have one??

A: The DNR offers you an easy way to acquire a permit by using the self-service website or are available from your local fire marshal (IT'S FREE). For your information burning is only permitted between 6:00pm and midnight and never on Sundays and holidays. Without a permit you could be found guilty of either a civil or criminal charge when burning in violation of Wisconsin laws. <u>http://dnr.wi.gov/burnpermits/</u>
